Our role in aged care

The Independent Health and Aged Care Pricing Authority (IHACPA) is an independent government agency. We provide evidence-based pricing and costing advice to the Australian Government on health and aged care services.

Our role in aged care is to provide expert residential aged care, residential respite care and in-home aged care pricing and costing advice that reflects the costs of delivering care. We provide this advice to the Minister for Health and Ageing. It is the government who then determines and announces the prices for aged care services.

IHACPA is also responsible for assessment and approving applications for higher maximum accommodation payment amounts for residential aged care.

We deliver our annual program of work through public consultation and collaboration with our stakeholders, including:

- older people in Australia and their families, carers and representatives
- Australian Government, state and territory governments
- · advisory committees
- technical experts and clinicians
- aged care sector
- · the public.
